# Who is Blessed Carlo Acutis?

Carlo was born in London on 3 May 1991 and died in Monza, Italy in 2006 as a result of leukaemia. He was just 15 years old.

Carlo had a deep devotion to the Holy Eucharist and used his shared passion for technology to create a website that documented approved Eucharistic Miracles.

In his short, yet very zealous Catholic life, he was on a mission to raise awareness, and share proof of the miraculous real presence of Jesus Christ, in the Holy Eucharist.

He was quoted as saying that the Holy Eucharist was "the highway to heaven". Carlo was beatified in 2020 and is currently in the process of becoming a canonised saint.

He is a role model for young people around the world, drawing many deeper into their Catholic faith.


## Meeting by the Archdiocese for ALL THE VOLUNTEERS in the Parish

# Sunday 21st July 2024 Sixteenth SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME Year B

First Reading Jeremiah 23:1-6 A reading from the prophet Jeremiah The remnant of the flock I will gather to me, and bring them back to their pastures.

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered – it is the Lord who speaks!

This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds – it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be and rest for a while'; for there were so many coming fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost it is the Lord who speaks!

'See, the days are coming -it is the Lord who speaks when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The Lord our integrity.'

## Responsorial Psalm Ps 22. R. v.2 (R.) The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

- 1. The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit. (R.)
- 2. He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name. If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil would I fear. You are there with your crook and your staff, with these you give me comfort. (R.)
- 3. You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes. My head you have anointed with oil; my cup is overflowing. (R.)
- 4. Surely goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life. In the Lord's own house shall I dwellfor ever and ever. (R.)

#### Second Reading Ephesians 2:13-18 A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians Christ, our peace, has made us one.

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law.

This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. In his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.

Gospel Acclamation John 10:27 Alleluia, alleluia! My sheep listen to my voice, says the Lord; I know them, and they follow me. Alleluia!

## Gospel Mark 6:30-34 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark They were as sheep without a shepherd.

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. Then he said to them, 'You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and going that the apostles had no time even to eat. So they went off in a boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But people saw them going, and many could guess where; and from every town they all hurried to the place on foot and reached it before them. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to teach them at some length.
